James H Dowd was born in 1884. He worked as a draftsman, etcher, and painter. He was a regular contributor to *The Graphic* and in 1906 began to have his work published in *Punch* magazine. In 1925 he created the illustrations for a story which appeared in the *London Evening News* on December 24. The story was entitled "Winnie The Pooh" [and] was later to become the first chapter of A. A. Milne's book (though the illustrations in the book were not drawn by Dowd). He provided drawings for several books including *Important People* (1930) and *People and Importance* (1934). —www.caerleon.net
